

Robotic Surgery Has Arrived at Northern Health, Now Help Us Keep Our Promise

At Northern Health, we believe our community deserves access to the very best in healthcare, not just what's available in the inner city. That's why we are proud to share that Northern Hospital Epping is now home to a \$2.5 million robotic-assisted surgical platform, a ground-breaking innovation that is already changing lives.

For many years, robotic surgery has been the standard of care in leading hospitals across Australia and internationally. Now, patients in Melbourne's north no longer need to travel long distances for this technology. It is here, close to home, where it is needed most.

Robotic-assisted surgery is a game-changer. Unlike traditional open surgery, the robotic platform offers unmatched precision and accuracy, with advanced 3D vision and highly flexible instruments. These capabilities make minimally invasive procedures possible even in the most delicate cases.

For patients, this means less pain, fewer complications, shorter hospital stays and a faster return to everyday life. Imagine a man diagnosed with prostate cancer. With traditional surgery, his recovery might involve nearly a week in hospital and several weeks at home. With robotic-assisted surgery, he may be home the next day, returning to his life sooner and with greater confidence.

Or consider a woman with endometriosis, a painful and often debilitating condition. Robotic surgery allows our surgeons to treat her condition with greater accuracy and care, dramatically improving her quality of life.

Each year, more than 200 patients at Northern Health are expected to benefit from this technology, including those facing cancers of the prostate, kidney, bladder, lungs, and bowel, as well as patients with urgent health issues such as hernias, organ prolapse, and obesity-related conditions.

This technology doesn't just benefit patients. It also supports our dedicated surgical teams. The robotic platform reduces surgeon fatigue and strain during long, complex procedures. With dual consoles, it allows surgeons to train the next generation right here at Northern Health, helping us attract and retain the very best surgical talent.

As Divisional Director of Surgery, Dennis Gyomber explains:

"With this phased approach, I anticipate upwards of 200 patients each year will benefit from this innovative equipment. Your gift will have a profound and lasting impact, not only on the lives of individual patients, but on the growth of Northern Health as a leader in cancer care for years to come."

The most important part of this story is that the robotic machine is already here and already saving lives. Patients are being treated with this breakthrough technology today, right here in Melbourne's north.
